INFORMATION TO BE INCLUDED IN THE REPORT

1. Business.

Grenlec's sales performance is inextricably linked to what occurs in the wider Grenadian economy. Since the global economic downturn we have seen contraction in Grenada's GDP from a high of 7.70% in 2009 to a low of an estimated 1.40% in 2010. Consequently growth rates in Grenlec have averaged 3.81% over the last three years which is down from an average in prior years of over 7%. Energy sales in 2010 were 185.70GWh compared to 178.20GWh in 2009 with commercial being the largest sector at 101.97GWh.

Low growth rates mean that the company's management has to place more emphasis on efficiency improvements and cost containment in order to continue adding value. The Electricity Supply Act (ESA) of 1994 restricts the company mainly to efficiency improvements in order to grow its profit margin. In 2010 system losses improved from 9.20% in 2009 to 8.22% which meant that the increase in sales units of 4.21% did not equate with an increase in generated units of 2.83%.

Fuel efficiency following its record high of 19.20 kWh per imperial gallon in 2009 fell marginally to 19.11 in 2010. This was the second best fuel efficiency that Grenlec has ever achieved which is important as it benefits both the customer and the company. Any positive impact of fuel efficiency above the baseline established in the ESA is shared between the Company and the customer, while any negative impact below the same baseline is borne by the Company alone. The impact of these high efficiencies in cushioning the increase in the fuel charge to customers is even greater when fuel prices are rising as they did in 2010 with an average price of USD 79.61 per barrel compared to USD 61.65 in 2009. Sustaining fuel efficiency improvements in recent years has been vital to the Company's ability to maintain profit levels in an environment of lower growth rates and comparatively higher fuel prices.

Small open economies such as ours are highly dependent on the larger countries recovery from the global economic recession for the creation of investment opportunities and growth. Since this recovery is predicted to be slow and weak in the next two years it means that the current business environment is unlikely to change significantly. Growth rates seen over the last three years of around 4% can thus be expected to be maintained. World fuel prices have been on the increase since the second quarter of 2009 and there isn't any indication that this trend will not continue in 2011. This will mean higher electricity rates which can create added pressure on customers thereby further restricting the potential for growth. To counter this, the company has begun to update and extend its Vision 2013 strategic plan to prepare it to face the new challenges.

3. Legal Proceedings.

6. Financial Statements and Selected Financial Data.

The audited financial statements for 2010 are included herewith. This incorporates the Auditor's report, Statement of Financial Position with comparatives for 2009, Statement of Comprehensive Income, Statement of Cash Flows and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes. These statements comply with International Financial Reporting Standards.

7. Disclosure about Risk Factors.

Hurricanes etc.

Hurricanes remain the single most significant risk factor faced by GRENLEC. Ivan and Emily struck Grenada in 2004 and 2005 respectively causing major damage. In the case of Ivan over 80% of our distribution system had to be rebuilt at a cost which exceeded ECD 20M. However, the rebuilding of the system after Ivan left it more robust and better able to withstand a similar event as was seen with Emily. Despite this improvement, the

risk is still substantial because the hurricane reserve which was totally spent in the rebuilding is now only 50% of what it cost to restore the system after Ivan. Given this fact and our inability to obtain reasonably priced insurance for our distribution system it is important that we continue to keep maintenance of the system as a priority in order to mitigate against the impact of a hurricane.

Grenelc currently has a monopoly on the generation and supply of electricity in the tri island state. Should there be a change in legislation which changes the current landscape and introduces competition it would affect operations and possibly profitability.

Sharply increasing fuel prices as occurred in 2008 can also over the short run impact negatively on the company's cash flow and profitability. However, once fuel prices fall this is reversed and there is a positive impact in both cases.

10. Management's Discussion and Analysis of Financial Condition and Results of Operation.

Grenlec's financial condition as reflected in its Statement of Financial Position as at December 31, 2010 is a very healthy one. The company had total assets of \$190.06M with net assets of \$71.32M. The long term borrowings of the company was lower than that of the previous year by \$8.96M as repayments were made in accordance with bond and other agreements. Another positive indicator is the decline in trade and other receivables of \$1.79M. Added to this the company ended the year with a strong cash balance of \$11.99M.

The healthy financial condition is further reflected in the fact that all of the covenanted ratios were better than the target as stipulated in the ECSE bond and other long term loan agreements. Of particular note is the interest coverage ratio of 8.51:1 as compared to a covenant of 2:1.

(i) Capital Resources

In 2010 construction of a new administrative building at a contracted cost of \$4.8M begun. This was financed by \$3.8M from the sale of the old administrative building in 2008 and internally generated funds to the tune of \$1M. At year end \$1.5M of this cost was committed and not yet expended. Other regular capital expenditure in 2010 of \$4.7M was financed from recurrent operations. Budgeted capital expenditure for 2011 of \$10.60M is expected to be made from recurrent

resources. Grenlec's cash position and performance indicates that it is quite capable of managing regular capital expenditure without requiring external financing.

(ii) Results of Operations.

Non fuel revenue grew by 5.84% to \$79.71M, driven by sales growth of 4.21% and the continued impact over the first five months of the rate increase of 4.69% which was implemented in May 2009. The non fuel rates were not increased in 2010. On the other hand world fuel prices increased by 27.21% over 2009 which lead to fuel revenue being higher in 2010 by \$18.52M or 28.59%. The fuel charge is intended to recover the cost of fuel but increasing prices means that the recovery rate will be lower due to a lag effect. With the rising prices in 2010 the recovery rate was 99.27% compared to 101.47% in 2009 which is a difference in net revenue of \$1.53M.

Non fuel expenses grew by 4.93% over that of 2009. Excluding depreciation expenses, the real growth was much lower at 1.72%. This was the result of cost containment measures implemented company-wide to improve efficiencies and maximize returns, while maintaining a safe and reliable operation. Finance cost decreased by 10.42% as there were no new loans and repayments on existing ones were made as scheduled.

Profit before taxes of \$14.63M in 2010 grew by 15.69% over that of 2008 and was second only to 2008 when there was exceptional net fuel revenue of \$6.13M and the gain on the sale of the administrative building of \$2.65M. As a result the company increased its dividend in the final quarter from 11cents per share to 12 cents per share. The company had a dividend payout ratio before provision for the hurricane reserve of 69.46% thus retaining \$1.86M for reinvestment in order to sustain the quality of the earnings.

Grenlec's net cash position at December 31, 2010 was \$9.20M marginally below the \$9.93M at the end of 2009. The outflow of \$3.3M for the construction of the new administration building and the additional \$2.83M in income tax paid compared to 2009 must be considered in analyzing the cash flow performance. Also trade and other payables were reduced by \$4.35M in 2010 as against an increase of \$6.60M in 2009. This cash performance was in keeping with our expectations and reflective of the strong liquidity position of the company.
